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OTTUMWA --- Indian Hills Community College has announced that a new totally online course in the college's Aviation Pilot Training program will be offered starting during the spring term. The term begins February 22.

The offering, Maintenance Responsibilities, is a three-credit course designed for aviation operations personnel, aircraft owners, pilots, mechanics and ground support personnel. It will allow those workers to learn the basics to keep their aircraft properly maintained for safe and legal operation.

Topics included in this course include Aircraft Certification, Repair and Inspection Responsibilities, Record Keeping, Airworthiness Directive and Safety Bulletin Compliance, Deferred Maintenance and Minimum Equipment List Preparation and Usage, and FAA Supplemental Type Certificate and Major Alteration and Repair Approvals. Other topics are Certification and Maintenance Responsibilities for Light Sport Aircraft, Home-Built and Experimental Aircraft, Parts Approval Process, and Strategies for Scheduling Aircraft to Minimize Downtime.

This course is accredited by the North Central Association and is one of six courses offered totally online by Indian Hills in its Aviation Pilot Training program that can lead to an AAS-transferable college degree.

The ATP program is approved by the Veterans Administration for flight training and is a collegiate partner with the AOPA.
